- <u>For Honours in Humanities (B.A.Hons.in Bengali, English, Sanskrit, Political Science, History,</u> <u>Education, Journalism & Mass Communication, Sociology) students cannot opt for two (2)</u> <u>Science Generic elective subjects.</u>
- Science Subject: Economics; Botany; Psychology; Chemistry; Geography; Statistics; Film Studies; Mathematics, Physics, Microbiology
- Mathematics is **compulsory** for Economics Honours.
- Physics and Mathematics is **compulsory** for Chemistry Honours.
- <u>Elective subjects (Geography, Psychology, Journalism & Mass Communication, and Film</u> <u>Studies) will be offered subject to availability of seats. (Confirmation at time of admission)</u>
