NSS REPORT 2022-2023
National Service Scheme in Muralidhar Girls' College provides opportunities to the NSS volunteers to take part in various community service activities. Under the leadership and supervision of the programme officers, Dr. Minati Saha (Unit 1) and Dr Sampriti Biswas (Unit 2), all NSS committee members of the college work together, to provide hands on experience to young students in delivering community service.

All NSS activities categorised under two different categories - General activities and activities under Special Camp.

Bratachari Training Programme - Duration of the training was from 30th April 2022 to 20th June 2022.

This is a 30 hours course and 28 students underwent the training. The course content includes theoretical knowledge and practical sessions on tying triangular bandage and preparation of masks.
