- Define, compare and contrast biological, psychological, family, and social views of the causes and treatment of abnormal behavior.
- Identify the data analysis methods using statistical software (SPSS).
- Recognise the issues related to human behaviour in organizations.
- Understand the importance of counselling.
- Identify various misconceptions in the field of counselling and Psychology.
- Explain the importance of psychology in every sector of life.
- Identify the attainable career for graduating in Psychology according to self-interest.
