**Programme Outcomes (POs) of B.A. Sanskrit Honours:**

Bachelor's degree in Sanskrit is awarded upon completion of three full years of the subject study at the undergraduate level. The learning at the end of the course enables the student to have the academic, behavioral and social competencies as given below which is our Programme Outcome (PO) :

<b>PO 1</b>	<b>Proficiency in Academics:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Basic communication skills in understanding Sanskrit with LSRW (Listening, Speaking, Reading &amp; Writing) capacities.</li><li>• Skill adaptability in specific areas.</li><li>• Usage of critical thinking while correlating concepts with personal experiences.</li><li>• Usage of Shastric discipline and ancient traditional learning while discriminating others.</li><li>• Articulation of ideas, literary writing, innovations and effective presentation skills in Sanskrit as well as in other native Indian languages and English.</li><li>• Competency building to convey the society at large about Indic Knowledge and wisdom.</li><li>• Being technically sound to utilize various e-resources, social media network etc. for furthering the purposes of Sanskrit education.</li></ul>
<b>PO 2</b>	<b>Personal &amp; Behavioral Competence:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Self-respect and respect for others.</li><li>• Self-confidence in executing and planning and execution of tasks.</li><li>• Development of positive attributes such as empathy, compassion, social participation, accountability etc.</li><li>• Development of cultural and historical sensibility particularly indigenous traditions, socio-cultural context and diversity.</li><li>• Competency in communicating, interacting, listening, speaking and observational skills.</li><li>• Art of negotiation, working in group and independently, interacting with stakeholders.</li><li>• Developing patriotism with a sense of responsibility</li><li>• Accentuating memory power and concentration in a specific area.</li></ul>
<b>PO 3</b>	<b>Social Competence:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Ethical, social and ecological responsibility and acknowledging the dignity and presence of others, learning of values and social concerns reflected in social participation</li><li>• Objective and unbiased work attitude, avoiding unethical behaviors such as data fabrication and plagiarism, observing code of conduct, respecting intellectual property rights and being aware of the implications and ethical concerns of research studies.</li><li>• Commitment to health and wellbeing at different levels (e.g. individual, organization, community, society).</li><li>• Collaboration, cooperation and realizing the power of groups and community.</li><li>• Analyzing social problems and understanding social dynamics.</li><li>• Gender sensitization including gender respect, respect for one's own gender, dealing with gender confusion and gender identity issues.</li><li>• Commitment to keep the environment clean and green.</li></ul>

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### Programme Specific Outcomes (PSOs) of B.A. Sanskrit Honours:

PSO 1	<b>Introduction to Contents of Sanskrit:</b> Offering learning opportunities to orient the students towards the scientific and humanistic study of the Sanskrit language.
